

Athletic Hall of Fame Election Procedures

Nomination Process:

- 1. The vice president for institutional advancement shall supervise the Athletic Hall of Fame nomination process.
- 2. Nominations at-large will be accepted from any member of the St. John's community past or present (i.e., coaches, students, parents, staff, or faculty).
- 3. Alumni nominees must have graduated at least ten years ago. For the 2023 induction cycle, this includes up to and including the 2013 graduating class. Coaches must have left active high school coaching for at least one year.
 - a. An entire team from one particular season may be nominated for outstanding group achievement. The season must be at least ten years old.
 - b. Individuals may be nominated posthumously.
- 4. The top ten by total number of at-large nominations will be placed on the Hall of Fame ballot. The supra electors will vote to break any ties for the tenth position on the final ballot.
- 5. A call for nominations will be extended to the Athletic Hall of Fame Committee. Each committee member has one elector nomination along with four at-large nominations. Any nominee who receives a minimum of two (2) elector nominations will be automatically placed on the final ballot.
- 6. The final ballot will consist of the top ten at-large nominations and any nominee who receives at least two (2) elector nominations from a committee member.

Election Process:

- 1. The Athletic Hall of Fame Committee will vote for their top ten candidates by rank from the final ballot. Each nominee will get a certain number of points for each vote from one to ten. For example, a number one vote = 10 points, and a number ten vote = 1 point.
- 2. Incomplete ballots will not be accepted. If a ballot is not submitted for three straight elections, you will be removed from the voting committee.
- 3. The voting results from the final ballot will be collected and tabulated by the supra electors to determine the Hall of Fame class.
- 4. The supra electors by unanimous vote may remove or add a nominated candidate from the final list.

Athletic Hall of Fame Committee:

- 1. All living individual members of the Hall of Fame (not team HOF members).
- 2. All head coaches past and present who have coached at the school for at least seven years.

Supra Electors:

- 1. Vice president for institutional advancement
- 2. Current director of athletics
- 3. Current elector appointed by the president
- 4. Current St. John's president
